Dear Parents, Students, Colleagues, & Friends of Endeavour:

Wednesday night (10/17/07), we held our second Endeavour Advisory meeting this school year. It was well attended and much was presented and decided:

******* The Great Tesla Coil Presentation *******

The Tesla Coil is coming Mar 4 & 5. Many ideas for promoting this event were discussed and planned.

We have three target audiences:

- 1) Middle school students (especially 8th grade science)
- 2) High school students (especially Alg 1 and above)
- 3) Parents, siblings, Community members, and students at other schools in SLO county.

In order to address these audiences we plan 3 presentations in the PRHS gymnasium:

- 1) Tuesday evening (3/4/07) at 7 till 8:30 pm. for parents, community members, and other students
- 2) Wednesday morning (3/5/07) at 10 am for PRHS students (during advisement period)
- 3) Wednesday morning (3/5/07) at 11 am for MS students.

It is assumed that Lewis students can walk over to the high school. We are trying to arrange bus transportation for Flamson Middle School.

******* Call to Middle School Science Teachers *******

The Tesla presentation is the first followed by Family Science Night, Registration, and finally with the Grand Balloon Fest event at the end of the school year.
