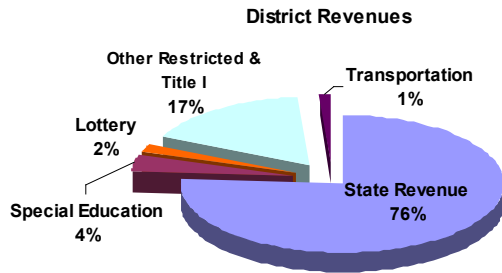
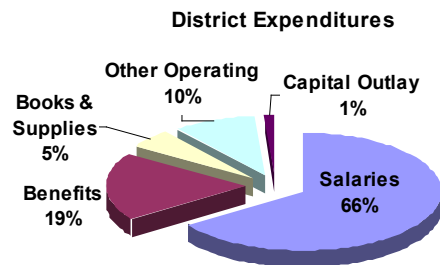


OUR BUDGET

Paso Robles Public Schools' budget totals over 55 million dollars. The majority of the revenues are from the state which yields funds based on a state-determined dollar amount multiplied by the average number of students who are in attendance throughout the school year. A very small amount is generated through the lottery. Other funds are restricted to specific categorical programs. Less than 10% of the district's revenue is from federal sources, all of which is for categorical programs.



The majority of the district's expenditures are for employee salaries and benefits. It takes people to teach people, and close to 85% of the operating budget is spent on salaries and benefits.
