PRHS Students Place at National SkillsUSA Competition

Paso Robles, CA (July 12, 2018) – Paso Robles High School (PRHS) students had a successful competition at the recent SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference in Louisville, Kentucky. The top finisher from PRHS was Mason Brown who earned a silver medal in the category of Telecommunications Cabling.

Overall, eight PRHS students qualified for the national competition by earning gold medals at the state contest this past April. In addition to the silver medal by Mason Brown, several students placed in the top ten at nationals: John Nash (5th – plumbing), Zac Alves (7th - Welding), and Maddie Harris (8th – First Aid/CPR).

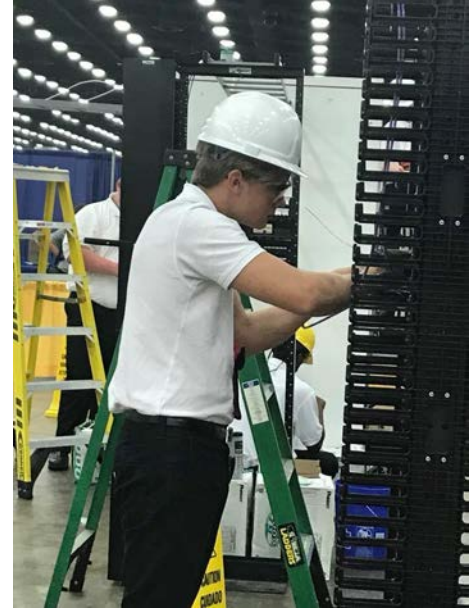
